We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behavior in ice hockey and create apositive environment where children can enjoy the game. As a parent, we recognize that you have a big part to play.

As a parent we expect you to:

Essentials

- Ensure that your child has the appropriate kit and equipment, including any food, drinkand medication they may need for training and games.
- Ensure that your child is punctual for training and games and is picked up promptly.
- Inform the person in charge of the training or event if you are going to be late or anotherperson is collecting your child.
- Sign and return all necessary consent forms and paperwork and update club officialsimmediately if anything changes.
- Maintain a positive relationship with coaches and other club officials.
- Follow all guidelines laid down by the national governing body and the club (includingany social media and photography guidance).
- Do not interrupt training or games other than in an emergency.
- Ensure your child understands their code of conduct.
- Raise any concerns or complaints regarding club incidents through your club's official channels and understand that England Ice Hockey can only handle issues raised withinthe remit of our complaints policy.

Behaviour

- Remember that children play for fun and get a wide range of benefits from participating participating sport, like making friends and developing social skills.
- Always promote the positive aspects of the sport (e.g., fair play).
- Applaud effort as well as success, from both teams.
- Encourage your child to value their performance and not just results.
- Give encouragement to your child when they've done well and support them when they are struggling; do not ridicule or shout at a child for making mistakes or losing a game.
- Always support the decisions of officials during games.
- Be gracious in victory or defeat.
- Let the coach do their job and do not confuse players by telling them what to do.
- Never engage in or tolerate any offensive behaviour or language.
- Encourage players to show respect to everyone in the game, including team-mates, theopposition, coaches, managers, officials and spectators, leading by example.
- Respect people's differences and not bully or discriminate against others for reasonssuch as race, gender, sexuality, background or ability.
- Report any incidents of bullying or abuse, even if you're just a witness.
- Never engage in public criticism of referees or England Ice Hockey.

• Understand that if you don't follow the code of conduct, actions may be taken againstyou by your club or National Governing Body.

As a parent you have the right to:

- Feel welcome in your club regardless of ability, physical appearance, sexual orientation, gender, race, or religion.
- Be assured that your child is safeguarded during their time in ice hockey.
- Know how to access your club and England Ice Hockey's policies and procedures.
- Be informed by your club of any problems or concerns relating to your child whereappropriate.
- Know the procedure should your child be involved in an accident or become injured.
- Provide your consent or otherwise for filming and photography, trips away andotherwise.
- Know who your club's Designated Safeguarding Lead is and how to contact them.
- Be informed of your club's internal complaints process and who to contact.
- Be listened to and treated fairly when you raise concerns to your club.
